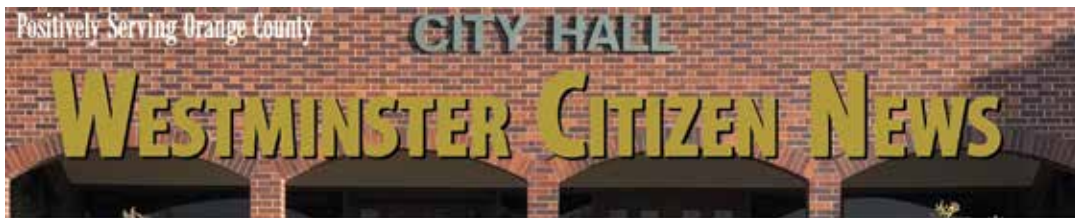

WHY DO WE CELEBRATE MEMORIAL DAY? THE HISTORY OF MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day is more than just a weekend off from work, an excuse to throw a picnic, or a reason to take a weekend trip, it is a national holiday. The history behind Memorial Day seems to have gotten lost in the shuffle throughout the years. With May 27th growing closer, take time to familiarize yourself with the history of Memorial Day, and why we celebrate this holiday.

Memorial Day, originally known as "Decoration Day," was established on May 5 1868 by General John Logan, the national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic. The first observation of Memorial Day took place on May 30th 1868, by decorating the graves of fallen Union and Confederate soldiers in Arlington National Cemetery.

Here is an excerpt from General Logan's "General Orders No. 11," officially declaring "Decoration Day."

"The 30th day of May, 1868, is des-

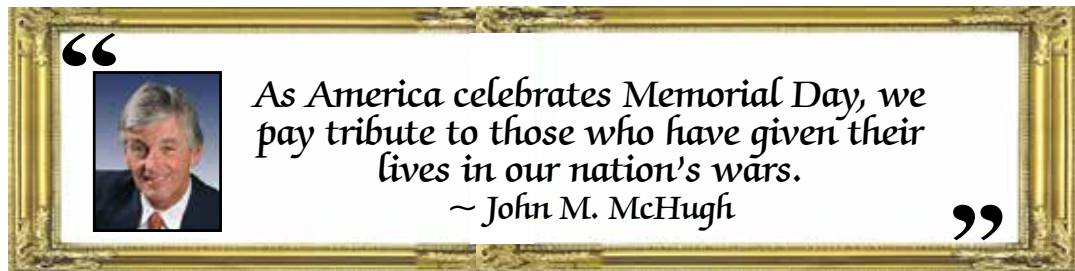
ignated for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, and hamlet church-yard in the land. In this observance no form of ceremony is prescribed, but posts and comrades will in their own way arrange such fitting services and testimonials of respect as circumstances may permit."

New York was the first state to officially recognize Memorial Day as a Holiday in 1873, and all of the Northern states had followed suit by 1890. The Southern states didn't recognize Memorial Day until after World War 1 when it was changed from recognizing soldiers who lost their lives fighting in the Civil War, to soldiers who lost their lives fighting in any war America participated in.

The reason that students and employees are given the day off on Memorial Day, is so they can properly observe the

holiday. When the holiday was originally established nationally it was intended to give patrons the opportunity to visit the graves of our fallen soldiers, attend memorials, fly the American flag at half staff until noon, and acknowledge the "National Moment of Remembrance" at 3:00 PM. The "National Moment of Remembrance" is when everyone has a moment of silence and if you are in a public place "Taps" is played.

So, this year on Memorial weekend take a moment to remember why you don't have to go to work or school. If you are taking a trip with your family, make your rest stop at a memorial or Veteran's cemetery and observe the men who have fought for our country. If you are having a get together at your home, or attend one at someone else's home, give a little speech at 3:00 and call for a moment of silence to remind your friends and family why you are all able to get together that weekend.

THE NATIONAL COLD WAR CENTER AND WOODROW WILSON CENTER PARTNER TO ELEVATE THE STORY OF THE WAR THAT SAVED THE WORLD

In 1987, President Ronald Reagan boldly stood before one of the iconic symbols of the Cold War and, in words that shape his legacy, demanded from the Soviet leader, “Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall.”

Two years later the Berlin Wall came down. Then, in 1991, the Cold War ended with the dissolution of the Soviet Union.

Lasting nearly a half-century, the war profoundly changed and, perhaps, saved the world.

During that time, the United States and Russia engaged in a global contest over different ways of life; threatened and deterred each other with vast arsenals of nuclear weapons; tested one another’s resolve in 1962 during the Cuban Missile Crisis; raced to become the first country to put a human in space; and sought allies and influence throughout the world.

A key component of the U.S. military strategy during the Cold War was the Blytheville Air Force Base in northeastern Arkansas. It closed in 1992, but throughout the post-World War II conflict, the base - and especially its alert center - formed a vital part of the U.S. Strategic Air Command, which controlled most of the U.S. nuclear weapons and the aircraft and missiles that delivered those weapons.

Today, this former Arkansas Air Force base is being transformed into the home of the National Cold War Center (NCWC),

a museum and historic site dedicated to honoring Cold War veterans, preserving history, and advancing understanding and debate about the world’s most protracted and expensive war and its legacies for today.

To elevate its mission on a national and international level, the NCWC has partnered with the distinguished Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars (Wilson Center) in Washington, D.C. Chartered by Congress as a public-private partnership and affiliated with the Smithsonian Institution, the Wilson Center is a premier research institute on Cold War history and its vast network of relationships and resources in the international policy research community will support and strengthen the NCWC’s goal to become America’s official museum of the Cold War.

The partnership is poised to enhance the NCWC’s unique mission “to comprehensively tell the story of the Cold War, informed by the experiences of those who fought, lived, and survived the conflict that has had such profound consequences for today’s world.”

Dr. Christian Ostermann, an award-winning historian and the longtime director of History and Public Policy at the Wilson Center, will direct the historic collaboration. A world-renowned scholar of the Cold War, he brings decades of experience and a strong vision for the future National Museum of the Cold

War. Working with Blytheville community leaders, the NCWC’s National Advisory Board, and federal, state, and private-sector partners, Ostermann aims to help the NCWC turn its historic Ready Alert Facility into a state-of-the-art educational site that draws visitors from across the globe to learn about the Cold War.

“Understanding the history of the Cold War is critical to making sense of our world today,” Dr. Ostermann said. “The ideological and geopolitical rivalry between capitalism and communism defined global politics for nearly half a century, leading to a nuclear arms race, regional and proxy wars, as well as cultural, economic, and technological transformations that hold profound lessons still vital in the 21st century.”

Mary Gay Shipley, chairman of the National Cold War Center board of directors, has been at the forefront of its development efforts since they launched in late 2016.

“This partnership with the world-renowned Wilson Center gives our efforts even more credibility. We had a tremendous gain when the 118th U.S. Congress established the National Cold War Center as America’s federal museum of the Cold War, and this is another huge step forward,” Shipley said. “We look forward to welcoming thousands of people to our community annually to learn more about this important time in world history.”



While the grand opening of the NCWC is slated for 2027, the NCWC currently provides visitors the opportunity to experience the history of the Blytheville Air Force Base (BAFB) and its role in the Cold War via its BAFB Exhibition, which opened in November 2020. Once fully open, the Center expects to welcome more than 50,000 visitors in its first year, fueling education and providing a boon to the tourism economy of the Arkansas Delta.

As the NCWC expands its role to the global stage through its new partnership with the Wilson Center, the Center looks to develop an unparalleled experience providing visitors a window into a conflict that echoes throughout modern society and remains deeply relevant to geopolitics in 2024.

BOATING COMMUNITY COMES ALIVE MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND

Some Safety Tips from BoatUS

After the brutal winter there's a mad rush for boaters to get back on the water for the summer boating season's annual kick-off, Memorial Day weekend. But the nation's largest recreational boaters group, Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS) says "not so fast," and urges boaters to be prepared by following these five tips:

Ensure all safety gear – life jackets, radio, flares and other items – are ready to go. If you have the newer, more comfortable inflatable life jackets, be sure to open them up, inspect and test by filling with air and let them sit overnight to ensure they will keep you buoyant. A free Vessel Safety Check is offered by the US Coast Guard Auxiliary and US Power Squadrons can also be requested by going to www.safetyseal.net.

Avoid a springtime sinking by ensuring any drive gear such as outdrive bellows (inboard/outboard), shaft packings (inboards), livewell and engine cooling plumbing, or through-hull fittings are not cracked, rotted or severely corroded. Boaters, in their rush to get back on the water, sometimes take short cuts on these critical safety and spring commissioning items that end up biting them on their undersides. Follow the step-by-step free spring commissioning checklist at www.BoatUS.com/springchecklist.



For freshwater boaters: If you keep your boat in a marina or dock that has electricity service, test and inspect to ensure no stray current is leaking into the water where it could potentially lead to Electric Shock Drowning, an often misunderstood and overlooked safety item. See <http://www.BoatUS.com/esdexplained> for more.

Have a back up plan to get home in case your boat won't get you back to the ramp or dock. On water or on the road assistance for a disabled boat trailer can be summoned with the free BoatUS Towing App, available at www.BoatUS.com/app.

Have fun and make everyone an important part of your crew. In

some areas, boating traffic could be significantly up so use the extra sets of eyes as lookouts, share the sunblock and have plenty of water aboard to stay hydrated. If alcohol is in your plans, celebrate the opening of the season back at the dock or home where you'll be in a much safer spot.

SOJOURN CELLAR WINEMAKER DINNER AT BLAIS'S CALIFORNIA ENGLISH

With my wine partner Frank Mangio already committed elsewhere, I knew my visiting wine-and-food-loving friend Rhonda Karp from Washington state would be the perfect guest for Sojourn Cellars' Spring 2025 Winemaker Dinner at California English in San Diego's Sorrento Mesa. I shared with Rhonda how much I've always enjoyed Sojourn's wines under the leadership of Randy Bennett, their winemaker and general manager.

Upon arrival, we were greeted by Sojourn's Head of Marketing & Customer Experiences, Sherrie Perkovich, CSW and WSET Level III. Prominently displayed was Sojourn's Spring 2025 Wine Release Newsletter featuring four new wines: 2023 Ueberroth Vineyard Pinot Noir, 2022 Monte Rosso Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon, 2022 Moon Mountain District Cabernet Sauvignon, and the 2021 Blanc de Blancs Sparkling, Sonoma Coast.

Sojourn Cellars produces acclaimed Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, and Cabernet Sauvignon wines, sourcing fruit from family-owned vineyards across Sonoma and Napa counties. Vineyard partners, from the fog-laced Sonoma Coast and Petaluma Gap to the sun-drenched slopes of Oakville, practice world-class viticulture, enabling Sojourn's "hands-off" winemaking approach to shine. Every decision at Sojourn, from vineyard sourcing to cellar techniques, is rooted in a passion for delivering extraordinary experiences. Their Tasting Salon in Sonoma and immersive events reflect their ethos: few things in life surpass a shared moment over a truly special glass of wine.

Richard Blais' California English merges California's sun-soaked bounty with classic English culinary touches. Executive Chef Blais, known for Top Chef All-Stars and FOX's Next Level Chef, is celebrated for innovation and refined creativity.

Sous Chef Eric Mickle brings over two decades of culinary excellence, having cooked at the Four Seasons, Michelin-starred restaurants, and multiple Gordon Ramsay kitchens worldwide. After serving as Corporate Chef for Specialty Restaurant Corp. and Assistant Dean at the Institute of Culinary Education, Mickle was recruited by Blais to help run

California English's kitchen.

The collaboration between chef and winemaker for the dinner was deliberate. Sojourn provided the bottles weeks ahead, allowing Mickle and Blais to craft pairings that danced in harmony.

The evening's ambiance and flawless service were a testament to Common Stock Hospitality, the restaurant group behind California English, Books & Records, and Common Stock. Director of Operations Jenna Angeloni ensured the service shined as much as the wines poured and the food served.

The reception began with the brand-new 2021 Blanc de Blancs Sparkling, 100% Chardonnay from Sonoma Coast, aged 30 months en tirage. Its creamy micro-bubbles paired exquisitely with radish fingers sourced from Girl and Dug Farms dressed in lemon tea butter and Maldon sea salt. At the table, lavender and Marcona almond scones accompanied the vibrant 2024 Rosé of Pinot Noir, a blend from eight Sonoma Coast vineyards including Sojourn's Sasaki Estate Vineyard as well as fruit from Gap's Crown, Silver Eagle and Walala Vineyards.

The first course featured Hamachi tartare poached in a Granny Smith apple nage with vadouvan curry and vanilla oil. The richness and spice harmonized with the 2023 Sonoma Coast Chardonnay, a product of a cool vintage that allowed long hang time and exceptional flavor development. The next course was root beer lacquered squab with sunchoke purée, confit leg farrotto, and cherry jus. Two Pinot Noirs elevated the course, 2023 Ueberroth Vineyard, sourced from Petaluma Gap's wind-swept terrain, had a Cab-like structure from its toughened skins. 2022 Gap's Crown Pinot Noir, a favorite of mine, had superb balance with blue fruit flavors and baking spice notes. Both wines soared with the dish's sweet glaze and nutty sunchoke puree.

The main course was braised short rib with potato purée and roasted root vegetables in a truffled Cabernet reduction. The wine pairing doubled again: 2022 Monte Rosso Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon, crafted from old vines on Red Hill Loam soils, offered deep layers of red and dark fruit with hints of chocolate and cassia. Alongside was the 2021 Oakville Cabernet

Sauvignon, a blend of Oakville Ranch Vineyard fruit with two additional Oakville vineyard blocks yielding lush tannins and vibrant notes of blackberry, raspberry, and mocha.

Dessert was a caramelized milk chocolate tart with burnt orange gel, candied blood orange, and whipped chocolate "aero"—a rich finale to a perfectly orchestrated evening. Guests could revisit any wine or taste gems not poured. I took the opportunity to enjoy a glass of 2023 UV Lucky Well Pinot Noir, featuring layered textures and a silky

finish from a mix of whole-cluster and destemmed fermentation. This is noted as a Sojourn collector's vintage. I agree with their assessment.

It was a delight having both Winemaker Randy Bennett and Chef Eric Mickle present throughout the evening, sharing commentary on each course and pairing. Their passion and thoughtfulness made this an exceptional wine and exquisite food experience. Learn more at sojourncellars.com and californiaenglishsd.com.

SAMUELI FOUNDATION GRANT APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN FOR \$10 MILLION IN NEW FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR NONPROFITS SERVING ORANGE COUNTY

Samueli Foundation Responds to Orange County Nonprofit Needs Assessment by Providing Unrestricted Philanthropic Support for Capital Projects and Hard-to-Fund Needs

In an effort to support an even wider range of critical Orange County nonprofit needs, The Samueli Foundation today launched two new, open application funds totaling \$10 million in 2025 funding. The newly created Breakaway and Build OC Funds are designed to address several of the findings that emerged from the recently released Orange County Nonprofit Needs Assessment (OCNNA), a novel research project commissioned by the Samueli Foundation, done in collaboration with the Orange County Community Foundation.

"The OCNNA provided an unvarnished, sobering window into the financial fragility of Orange County's nonprofit sector," said Lindsey Spindle, president of the Samueli Family Philanthropies. "Facing onerous application processes to access funds and heavy restrictions over the use of them, nonprofit leaders are often faced with impossible choices that leave their organizations weaker. These vulnerabilities ultimately threaten to compromise the nonprofit sector's ability to meet rising community demands for their services. We felt compelled to do something in response to what we learned from the OCNNA, and are thrilled to open these new, easy-to-access funding opportunities."

As of May 1, 2025, nonprofits serving Orange County are invited to apply for the following opportunities:

Hard-to-Fund Needs: The Breakaway Fund is a \$5 million grantmaking initiative designed to invest in critical yet traditionally underfunded areas. This fund provides flexible, accessible funding for Orange County-serving organizations to pilot new, innovative ideas; upgrade essential infrastructure and technology; strengthen leadership capacity and retain key staff. The Breakaway Fund is structured to be responsive, low-barrier, and inclusive, ensuring that both emerging and established nonprofits have the resources needed to scale their impact without the constraints of conventional funding models. Grant awards will range from \$50,000-\$100,000.

Capital Funding: A \$5 million Build OC Fund to support Orange County-based nonprofits' capital projects, consisting of individual grants up to \$1 million.

The Samueli Foundation also announced a separate \$5 million,

five-year investment in the Leading for Impact (LFI) and Leadership Accelerator program run by the globally renowned Bridgespan Group, providing scholarship-supported access to strategic coaching, leadership development and peer-learning opportunities for 100 nonprofit executive teams. Through a mix of classroom workshops, team-led projects and executive coaching, LFI equips leaders with the skills and tools to strengthen their organizations, drive long-term sustainability and increase their community impact. Participating organizations contribute a portion of the program cost, ensuring shared investment in their growth and success. The form to express interest in participation in the Leading for Impact (LFI) and Leadership Accelerator program is also now open.

"Orange County's non-profit organizations engage in some of our community's most challenging work, such as supporting foster youth, combating local antisemitism, creating effective STEM learning environments, or preventing homelessness," said Lindsey Spindle, president of the Samueli Family Philanthropies. "We hope these new funds help nonprofit leaders nurture local talent and modernize their operations, thereby giving them an even stronger basis from which they can provide mission-critical services to our community."

How to Apply
Applications for the two funds,

accessible via the Samueli Foundation website, were intentionally designed to be simple and straightforward. The Breakaway Fund application takes less than 20 minutes to complete and asks nonprofits to briefly explain how the grant would support their mission and strengthen their work.

Similarly, the Build OC Fund application focuses on understanding nonprofits' physical space constraints and the challenges those limitations create in expanding their services. The Samueli Foundation's website includes multiple resources to help potential applicants, including a frequently asked questions guide, video tutorials on how to apply, and a PDF of the application so people can anticipate what questions will be asked in the online portal before they begin.

Nonprofits can apply using the online application forms via <https://www.samueli.org/>. There are separate forms for each funding opportunity:

Nonprofits may submit up to two applications for the Breakaway Fund (\$50,000-\$100,000 each). The deadline for Breakaway Fund applications is Friday, June 13, 2025.

Nonprofits may submit only one application for the Build OC Fund (up to \$1,000,000). The deadline for Build OC Fund applications is Friday, June 27, 2025.

Grant recipients will be announced by October 2025 and will receive grant payment before December 31, 2025.

Further, nonprofits may complete the LFI and Leadership Accelerator program interest form by visiting <https://www.samueli.org/> to receive additional details regarding participation.

Servings: 2

Blue Cheese Chive Butter:

- 4 ounces unsalted butter, cubed
- 4 ounces blue cheese
- 1 tablespoon fresh chives, minced
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

Filet Mignon:

2 Omaha Steaks Private Reserve Filet Mignons

Filet Mignons

Omaha Steaks Private Reserve Rub
To make blue cheese chive butter: In medium bowl, use rubber spatula to fold and incorporate butter, blue cheese, chives, salt and pepper.

Section 18 inches of plastic wrap and place blue cheese chive butter about



6 inches above bottom. Take bottom portion of plastic wrap and place over blue cheese chive butter then shape butter into 1 1/2-inch cylinder.

Continue to roll butter in plastic; pinch ends of plastic wrap while rolling to tighten cylinder.

Once size and tightness are achieved,

tie off loose ends of plastic wrap and chill in refrigerator 1-2 hours, until blue cheese chive butter is chilled and firm.

To make filet mignon: Bring filet mignons to room temperature, about 20 minutes; pat dry and season on both sides with rub, to taste.

Prepare grill for 500 F direct heat.

For medium-rare, place steaks on grill 3-4 minutes. Flip and cook 2-3 minutes, or until 130-140 F internal temperature is reached.

Rest 7-8 minutes before serving.


